

# La Campania Wine Tasting

**Prosecco DOC Spumante Brut, 11%**

**Ca' Bolani**

**Varietal: 100% Glera**

Bright and luminous straw yellow. White and persistent mousse with very fine perlage. Pleasantly fruity with good aromatic intensity and hints of wisteria flowers and rennet apple. A very light note of sweet almond on the finish.



**Vermentino Aragosta DOC, 13%**

**Cantina Santa Maria La Palma**

**Varietal: 100% Vermentino di Sardegna**

Pale straw-yellow with soft hints of green. It is well-balanced and delicate though distinct, with a fresh fragrance reminiscent of ripe apples. Harmonious, dry but not harsh, crisp and rather lively, with a pleasantly lingering aftertaste of almonds.



**Falanghina Salento IGT, 13.5%**

**Masseria Altemura**

**Varietal: 100% Falanghina**

Straw yellow with greenish reflections. It displays light citrus notes, fresh hints of white flowers, accompanied by apricot and peach. The perfect balance of flavour and acidity producing a fresh and pleasant wine.



**Le Focchie Maremma Toscana DOC, 13.5%**

**Rocca di Montmassi**

**Varietal: 90% Sangiovese, 10% other varieties of the Estate**

Ruby-red colour, intense and full, the flavour offers pleasant scents of violets, cherries and wild berries. Good structure but pleasantly fresh and with a soft and persistent finish.



**Brachetto Piemonte DOC, 7%**

**Castello del Poggio**

**Varietal: 100% Brachetto**

Fine bubbles, aromas of strawberries, raspberries and overtones of rose petals.



# History of the Estates



## Ca' Bolani, Friuli Venezia-Giulia

An authentic jewel in Friuli with the greatest single extension of vineyards in Northern Italy, Ca' Bolani is a magnificent estate of vines made up of a fascinating mosaic of grape varieties both indigenous and international, capable of producing both elegant white wines and structured reds.

## Cantina Santa Maria La Palma, Sardinia

The strength of Santa Maria La Palma is the collaboration of numerous humble winemaking families who started to cultivate vines near Alghero fifty years ago. Passion and commitment are the key words for this estate which found its nobility in the hard work of its families.

## Masseria Altemura, Puglia

Located in the beautiful Salento Peninsula, an area with a long history but which is now looking determinedly forward towards the future, the Masseria Altemura Estate's mission is to offer a new perspective on the wines from the Southern Italian Region of Apulia. Geographically the Estate lies in the centre of Apulia, between the Ionian and the Adriatic Seas which lap the shores of the region. A unique maritime climate and abundant sunlight provide the Estate with very favourable conditions for grape growing.

## Rocca di Montemassi, Maremma, Tuscany

An enchanting corner of the Maremma in the heart of a unique terroir lying between the Tyrrhenian shoreline and the last remains of the metal mines in the hills, the cradle of the Etruscan civilization.

## Castello del Poggio, Piedmont
